EQUIPMENT

Whilst I endeavour to instil independence into the children in Year 4, your support with this is always much appreciated. Any help and reminders you can give your child to ensure they have the correct equipment at school would be great. The things they need on which day are listed below.

EVERY DAY - reading book, reading record book, fully stocked pencil case.

FRIDAY - PE kit, library book, homework book.

PENCIL CASES - Pencil cases should be simple in design and modest in size and should fit into your child's tray. The equipment they should have is a pencil, a black pen (if they have their licence) a ruler, a green biro and a glue stick (provided by school) They may also bring a rubber and a pencil sharpener if they wish but these should again be fit for purpose and fit comfortably inside their pencil case. If your child wishes to bring a set of pencil crayons, this is also fine. Children do not need felt tips, highlighters, gel pens, scissors, maths sets or novelty or large items.

Other things from home e.g. toys, cards, note pads, teddies etc should remain at home.

HOMEWORK

Please see over for a list of ideas for next half term's homework. These are ideas for the larger project based piece your child will complete. These can begin being brought to school on Mon 3rd Feb and should be in no later than Wed 12th Feb. This gives us time to look at and share all the children's hard work.

Your child's homework book needs to be in school every Friday. This will show the work they have completed over the week. This will, at a minimum, be their spellings but may also show evidence of them working on their times tables, reviewing something we've done in class, writing about their week or creating a piece of work of their own choice and interest.
