Here is your home learning for next week. Have fun completing this at home and remember to email your work to your teacher when you've done it. Your teacher will then email you back which is a lovely way for us to stay in touch.

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English My family. Who is in your family? Think about the people who live with you and also your wider family. Create a piece of writing all about your family.

ENGLISH/HISTORY Samuel Pepys mini biography. Using the Samuel Pepys PowerPoint, discuss his life. You can use the internet to do some more research of your own. Create a mini biography sharing some of your learning about Samuel Pepys.

ENGLISH/HISTORY Diary writing. Use <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/z7d7gwx/articles/zhgxcqt> to learn about Samuel Pepys and his diary. Can you see some similarities between what he wrote all those years ago and our experiences of lockdown? He wrote "How sad a sight it is to see the streets so empty of people"

Samuel's diaries have been very important and useful in helping people to understand about the past. One day, coronavirus will all be in the past and one day, it will be a huge part of England's history. We need to keep it alive for people who will be here in hundreds of years time so they know what it was like for us. Write your own diary saying what you have done throughout lockdown. Describe what it is like. What happens if you want to meet someone? What is it like at the supermarket? At school? What things can't we do? What does it feel like?

ENGLISH/HISTORY/CREATIVE Code writing. Think again about Samuel Pepys' diary. He wrote some of it in code. Create your own code by creating a symbol for each letter of the alphabet. Now write the first 3 or so sentences from your diary in code to test it out.

Maths This week, we're learning about problem solving. There are some problem cards and also a revision booklet for you to work with. You can also use Mathletics to complete some on line problem solving activities. Try to do a variety of things throughout your week.

ART/DT Sculpture Look at the PowerPoint with an adult. Discuss the work of Barbara Hepworth. Can you make a sculpture inspired by her work? In school, we're going to be using clay but if you're completing this at home, you can use whatever you like. What will you choose?

Art Family portraits. Look at the examples of Victorian photographs of families. Talk about these with an adult. Use pencil to draw your own family portrait.

PSHCE Keeping ourselves safe. Use the scenario cards along with the activity sheet and discuss your ideas with an adult.

SCIENCE Solids, liquids and gases. Use the PowerPoints to help you learn about this. There are different activity sheets for you to complete. Choose the one which you think you can manage. You can write and draw your own ideas or use the examples on the sheet to cut and stick if you want.
