Differentiation:

Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Place four words from a list beneath their antonyms. The question focuses on vocabulary taken from the National Curriculum Year 3/4 spelling list.

Expected Place six words from a list beneath their antonyms. The question focuses on vocabulary taken from the National Curriculum Year 5/6 spelling list.

Greater Depth Place six words from a list beneath their antonyms. The question focuses on vocabulary which is not found on the National Curriculum spelling lists.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Identify the word in a group of three which is an antonym for the others. The question focuses on vocabulary taken from the National Curriculum Year 3/4 spelling list.

Expected Identify the word in a group of four which is an antonym for the others. The question focuses on vocabulary taken from the National Curriculum Year 5/6 spelling list.

Greater Depth Identify the word in a group of four which is an antonym for the others. The question focuses on vocabulary which is not found on the National Curriculum spelling lists.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application and Reasoning)

Developing Write a possible definition for an antonym of a given word and explain that choice of definition. The question focuses on vocabulary taken from the National Curriculum Year 3/4 spelling list.

Expected Write a possible definition for an antonym of a given word and explain that choice of definition. The question focuses on vocabulary taken from the National Curriculum Year 5/6 spelling list.

Greater Depth Write a possible definition for an antonym of a given word and explain that choice of definition. The question focuses on vocabulary which is not found on the National Curriculum spelling lists.

Antonyms

Developing

1. **naughty: nice, good; accidentally: purposefully, deliberately**
2. **possible**
3. **Various answers, for example: 'happening at uneven or varying intervals', because 'regular' can mean 'happening at even intervals' and an antonym (irregular, occasional, etc.) would need to mean the opposite.**

Expected

4. **excellent: terrible, bad, awful; familiar: unfamiliar; unusual, different**
5. **disastrous**
6. **Various answers, for example: 'not enough to meet a need', because 'sufficient' means 'enough to meet a need' and an antonym (insufficient, inadequate, etc.) would need to mean the opposite.**

Greater Depth

7. **innocuous: damaging, baleful, injurious; haphazard: organised, systematic, methodical**
8. **attractive**
9. **Various answers, for example: 'well-meaning and kindly', because 'malicious' means 'intending or intended to do harm' and an antonym (benevolent, loving, etc.) would need to mean the opposite.**
