Dear Parents

As February half term approaches, I wanted to take the opportunity to write to all parents on behalf of the governing body to express my gratitude and support for you all at this difficult time.

Like so many things at the moment this has been a real challenge to achieve but, when we have managed to get a snapshot of life in the classroom, it has always been a delight.

I think its important that, as governors, we acknowledge not just the school staff, but also the amazing work parents have been putting in keeping education going. We know there are days when you might feel you've let your children down and days when you wonder how long you can keep this up for; everyone is in that boat and no one can do more than their best. You're letting no one down, you're being amazing.
