### September 2021 Reopening of Schools Risk Assessment **Face Coverings** 27.1.22 Face Coverings are **not** recommended for staff and visitors in corridors and in communal areas. From 27/01/2022, should individuals choose to wear face coverings within parts of the building this will be acceptable practice as long as this doesn't impede communication or discriminate against individuals. The use of face coverings may have a particular impact on those who rely on visual signals for communication.
